Amarok, a resident of Bako Tibe District of West Shewa Zone, was abducted on March 30/2014 by the Oromia Special Forces and the Combined Forces of the Defense Army.

The reason why these people were arrested is because the Amharas, whose mules and cattle were robbed by ONG Shene, wanted to search for their property.

When 4 of them were kidnapped and slaughtered by Ong Shene, one somehow escaped and told the family that 155 of the 180 Amharas who went to search for and pick up those bodies were abducted.

They hold a grudge against him. I don't understand what the Prime Minister is connecting Ethiopia's victory with Oromo taking power in this speech. Of course, the racist formula might allow them. They say that Ethiopia will not be defeated, it will not be destroyed, and they cite the victory of the Oromo people as proof of this, breaking the neck of the other. We are not like them, they say that Oromo are patient and strong, and for this reason, they describe it as a demonstration of Ethiopia's non-destruction. What kind of deep racism have you got into, man?! Still, let him come, let's try and show you, it's the behavior of a village teenager. Man has swallowed their government from head to toe.



I recently heard the absolutely dangerous speech that they said three years ago when they went to Bale and put Nishmelesh behind them, and I said that if the creator of this country was protecting it with his art, it would not have been able to sleep in peace one day after this kind of speech. Dare to lead a large country with such a narrow and village head is surprising. One thing I understand from the man's condition is that there is nothing under heaven that they do not dare. It does not touch them when they cross the border. They have no moral or conscience barriers to prevent them from doing what they want. It is a very surprising personality that the Prime Minister, who has such a racist and narrow-minded attitude, still dares to sit at the top of a country of many identities and cultures called "Ethiopia".

His speech was a clear message. Shimels Abdisa's speech at the Cross Square contradicts many times. The power of unity that was being fought (including me) did not give much space to his husband's speech. At that time we were floating in the drunkenness of change and could not look at the thorn in the mud. The Prime Minister was then and still is the same. The fact that there is not much difference between Bale and his speeches on the recent stage is a clear indication of the man's uniform attitude and approach. Some say that they were Ethiopia First, extremists dragged them into Oromo First. I don't agree with that. Such kind of blind racism is born with blinded eyes and hearts, not inherited by any influence after reaching the age of thinking.

In any case, his recent speech in Oromo is seen as an additional demonstration of the person's claim to be an agent of a "neighborhood" and nothing new. If the famous adage that pride leads to failure can be answered, not much else needs to be said for the time being. In another forum, in Amharic language, they come to say "Ethiopia will not be destroyed, Ethiopia will be ashamed and honored by its children."
